Dear Mr. Berkon and Mr. Modak:

On November 17, 2021, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Common Good Virginia and Lillie Louise Lucas in her official capacity as treasurer, of a complaint alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). A copy of the complaint was included in that notification. On January 3, 2022, we received your client's response to the complaint. On June 22, 2023, the Commission found: (1) no reason to believe that your client violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1)(A) and 11 C.F.R. § 300.61; (2) no reason to believe that your client made prohibited or excessive in-kind contributions, in violation of 52 U.S.C. §§ 30116(a), (f), and 11 C.F.R. §§ 110.1(b)(1), 110.9, in the form of email communications; (3) no reason to believe that your client violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(a)(1) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.1(b)(1) by making an excessive contribution by using its email list on behalf of Val Demings; and (4) no reason to believe that your client violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(c)(1), (2), (g) and 11 C.F.R. § 109.10 by failing to report independent expenditures. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
