To whom it may concern:

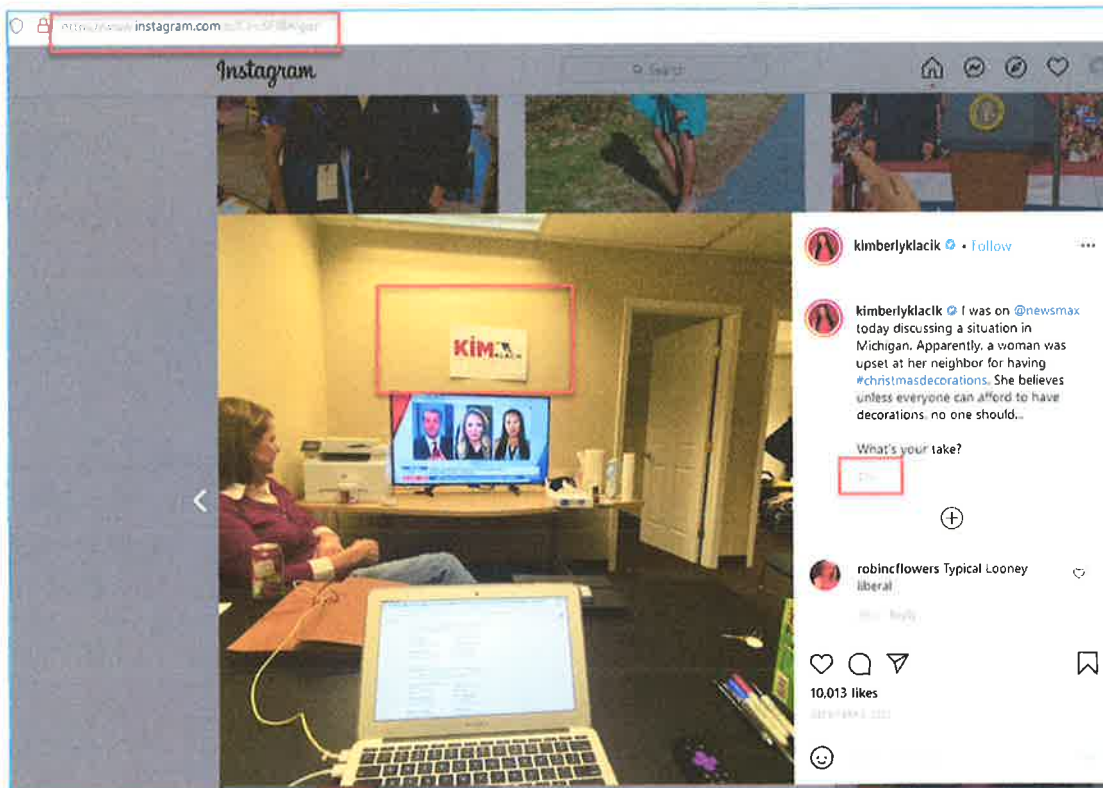
The following information is provided as an addendum to **MURs 7944 and 7945** regarding **Kimberly N. Klacik and/or the Red Renaissance PAC**.

Issue #1 – Under FEC regulations, Is it proper for Klacik to use proceeds from either her congressional bid and/or funds raised for the Red Renaissance PAC that she oversees to **pay the rent for a TV studio she uses as her own personal studio**? Over time, she has made appearances on TV *not in service to her campaign and/or the PAC – but to build her own brand* – on Newsmax, OAN, Rebel News (Canada), and other programming locally. There is a noticeable similarity between the studio she uses for these appearances and the location she has touted on social media as either her campaign headquarters and/or offices she uses to conduct Red Renaissance business:

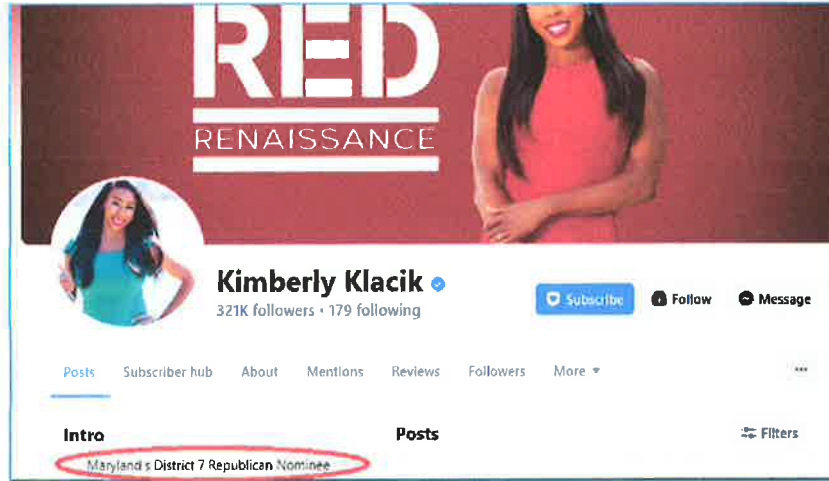

Issue #2: Through at least today, June 13, 2022, Klacik continues to advertise herself and raise funds on FACEBOOK as "Maryland's District 7 Republican Nominee." She has not filed to run in any upcoming election. The time of her 2020 congressional bid is long past. Is continuing to raise funds under these pretenses (false) allowed according to FEC regulations?

Issue #3: Widely reported throughout the news media, Klacik claimed – without evidence -- election fraud as the reason she lost her bid for a congressional seat in Maryland. However, at the same time she continued to raise funds either for her campaign and/or the Red Renaissance PAC. Is raising funds on the basis of false claims allowed per FEC regulations?
