#### COMPLAINT


- 1. This complaint is filed pursuant to 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(1) and is based on clear reason to believe that Francisco ("Frank") Lopez, Jr. (ID H2TX23165) is running an illegal dark money campaign for Congress.
- 2. Specifically, Mr. Lopez has violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104 and 11 C.F.R. § 104.5 by failing to disclose vital information about the sources of his campaign contributions and campaign spending.
- 3. These brazen violations are keeping voters in the dark about who is behind Mr. Lopez's candidacy and the interests he represents. These violations go to the heart of the federal campaign finance laws and the Federal Election Commission's ("FEC") function as a disclosure agency.
- 4. We demand an immediate review and appropriate sanctions in this matter. Since these violations are clear on their face, no investigation is needed.
- 5. Congressional candidates are required to file quarterly reports to disclose who is funding their campaigns and how they are spending that money.<sup>1</sup>
- 6. On January 6, 2022, Mr. Lopez filed a Statement of Candidacy (FEC Form 2)<sup>2</sup> and Statement of Organization (FEC Form 1)<sup>3</sup> for his campaign committee, "GrassTroops for Frank Lopez Jr."
- 7. Mr. Lopez' campaign was required to file a quarterly report no later than April 15, 2022. To date, according to the FEC's website, it has not yet done so:

- 8. Mr. Lopez's violation frustrates the important interests of the disclosure requirements to inform voters, deter corruption and the appearance of corruption, and to detect other campaign contribution and spending violations.<sup>5</sup>
- 9. Mr. Lopez's failure to disclose his campaign funding and spending is leaving voters in the dark and wondering: What is he hiding?
- 10. Mr. Lopez's failure to report his campaign finances is a clear violation of federal law. The FEC must take immediate action to compel Mr. Lopez to follow the law and impose appropriate sanctions.
