I, Vicktoria J. Allen, recording secretary of the Federal Election Commission executive session, do hereby certify that on June 07, 2022, the Commission took the following actions in the above-captioned matter:

1. Failed by a vote of 3-3 to:
 - a. Open a MUR.
 - b. Find reason to believe that Black Voters Matter Action PAC and Kamau Franklin in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(g)(1) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.4(c) by failing to timely report independent expenditures aggregating \$1,000 or more made after the 20th day, but more than 24 hours before an election.
 - c. Approve the Factual and Legal Analysis, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated April 27, 2022.
 - d. Authorize pre-probable cause conciliation.
 - e. Approve the proposed Conciliation Agreement, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated April 27, 2022.
 - f. Approve the appropriate letter.

Commissioners Broussard, Walther, and Weintraub voted affirmatively for the motion.

Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, and Trainor dissented.

2. Failed by a vote of 2-4 to:

Refer the matter to the Alternative Dispute Resolution Office.

Commissioners Trainor and Walther voted affirmatively for the motion. Commissioners Broussard, Cooksey, Dickerson, and Weintraub dissented.

3. Decided by a vote of 6-0 to:

- a. Open a MUR. **MUR 8012**
- b. Find reason to believe that Black Voters Matter Action PAC and Kamau Franklin in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(g)(1) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.4(c) by failing to timely report independent expenditures aggregating \$1,000 or more made after the 20th day, but more than 24 hours before an election.
- c. Approve the Factual and Legal Analysis, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated April 27, 2022.
- d. Authorize pre-probable cause conciliation.
- e. Approve the proposed Conciliation Agreement, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated April 27, 2022,
- f. Approve the appropriate letter.

Commissioners Broussard, Cooksey, Dickerson, Trainor, Walther, and Weintraub voted affirmatively for the decision.
