Dear Ms. Laham and Mr. Woodson:

On June 30, 2022, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Club for Growth Action and Adam Rozansky in his official capacity as treasurer ("Committee"), of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. On July 10, 2023, the Commission found, on the basis of the information in the complaint and information provided by you, on behalf of your client, that there is no reason to believe that the Committee violated 52 U.S.C. § 30119(a)(2) and 11 C.F.R. § 115.2(c). Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
