Dear Mr. Ghosh:

The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your Complaint dated July 25, 2022, but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe or dismiss as a matter of prosecutorial discretion the allegations that Angel Staffing, Inc., made a prohibited government contractor contribution in violation of 52 U.S.C. § 30119(a)(1) and 11 C.F.R. § 115.2(a). The Commission was also equally divided on whether to dismiss the allegation pertaining to Protect and Serve PAC and Charles Gantt in his official capacity as treasurer in connection with its receipt of a prohibited government contractor contribution. Accordingly, on May 31, 2023, the Commission closed the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).

The Federal Election Campaign Act allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).
