- d. Approve the Factual and Legal Analysis, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated May 16, 2023, subject to edits last circulated by Vice Chairman Cooksey's Office on Wednesday, July 12, 2023 at 8:53 a.m.
- e. Approve the appropriate letters.
- f. Close the file.
