Find reason to believe that Unknown Respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30122 by making a contribution in the name of another.

Commissioners Broussard and Weintraub voted affirmatively for the motion.

Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, Lindenbaum, and Trainor dissented.

## 2. Failed by a vote of 2-4 to:

Find reason to believe that SQI Limited, LLC, violated 52 U.S.C. §30122 by knowingly permitting its name to be used to make a contribution in the name of another.

Commissioners Broussard and Weintraub voted affirmatively for the motion.

Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, Lindenbaum, and Trainor dissented.

3. Failed by a vote of 2-4 to:

Take no action at this time with respect to the allegation that Herzog Technologies, Inc., Herzog Contracting Corp., and Herzog Transit Services, Inc., violated 52 U.S.C. § 30122 by making a contribution in the name of another.

Commissioners Broussard and Weintraub voted affirmatively for the motion.

Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, Lindenbaum, and Trainor dissented.

4. Failed by a vote of 1-5 to:

Take no action at this time with respect to the allegation that Save Missouri Values and Cabell Hobbs in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30122 by knowingly accepting a contribution in the name of another.

Commissioner Weintraub voted affirmatively for the motion. Commissioners Broussard, Cooksey, Dickerson, Lindenbaum, and Trainor dissented.

5. Failed by a vote of 2-4 to:

Approve the Factual and Legal Analyses, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated December 6, 2023.

Commissioners Broussard and Weintraub voted affirmatively for the motion.

Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, Lindenbaum, and Trainor dissented.

6. Decided by a vote of 4-2 to:

Dismiss the complaint.

Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, Lindenbaum, and Trainor voted affirmatively for the decision. Commissioners Broussard and Weintraub dissented.

7. Decided by a vote of 6-0 to:
