Dear Messrs. Gober and Wang:

On August 26, 2022, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Save Missouri Values and Cabell Hobbs in his official capacity as treasurer ("Save Missouri Values"), of a Complaint indicating violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. A copy of the Complaint was forwarded to your client at that time.

The Commission considered the Complaint, but there was an insufficient number of votes to take no action at this time with respect to the allegation that Save Missouri Values violated 52 U.S.C. § 30122 by knowingly accepting a contribution in the name of another. The Commission then voted to dismiss the Complaint in this matter. Accordingly, the Commission voted to close the file on February 29, 2024. One or more Statements of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
