This is in reference to the complaint filed with the Federal Election Commission on September 14, 2022, concerning VTDigger, *et al.* Based on that complaint, and after considering the circumstances of this matter and information provided in response to the complaint, the Commission determined to dismiss this matter and close the file effective March 3, 2025.

The General Counsel's Report, which more fully explains the basis for the Commission's decision, is enclosed. Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record today. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action within 60 days of the dismissal, which became effective today. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).

Respondents deny the allegations. The staging organizations all contend that they used pre-1 established, objective criteria and that Ericson did not satisfy the selection criteria.² WCAX further 2 argues that its activities are protected under the press exemption.³ Necrason Group, PLLC which is 3 alleged to have staged the debate with VTDigger, responds that it only sponsored the debate and 4 had no input regarding the candidate selection process.⁴ The Public Broadcasting Service responds 5 that it had no role in staging the debate with Vermont Public.⁵ Malloy states that he was not 6 involved in the decision to exclude Ericson. Welch submitted a Response, in which his principal 7 8 campaign committee Welch for Vermont and Julia Drost in her official capacity as treasurer (the "Welch Committee") later joined, stating that he was not involved in the decision to exclude 9 Ericson.8 10 11 12 13 14 15

Based on its experience and expertise, the Commission has established an Enforcement 1 2 Priority System using formal, pre-determined scoring criteria to allocate agency resources and assess whether particular matters warrant further administrative enforcement proceedings. These 3 criteria include (1) the gravity of the alleged violation, taking into account both the type of activity 4 5 and the amount in violation; (2) the apparent impact the alleged violation may have had on the 6 electoral process; (3) the complexity of the legal issues raised in the matter; and (4) recent trends in 7 potential violations and other developments in the law. This matter is rated as low priority for 8 Commission action after application of these pre-established criteria. Given that low rating, we 9 recommend that the Commission dismiss the Complaint, consistent with the Commission's prosecutorial discretion to determine the proper ordering of its priorities and use of agency 10 resources. 11 We also recommend that the Commission close the file effective 30 days from the date 11 12 the certification of this vote is signed (or on the next business day after the 30th day, if the 30th day 13 falls on a weekend or holiday) and send the appropriate letters.
