**CONSENT TO EXTEND THE TIME  
TO INSTITUTE A CIVIL LAW ENFORCEMENT SUIT**

As consideration for the Federal Election Commission granting an extension of time in the audit of The Ute PAC that is being conducted pursuant to 52 U.S.C. § 30111(b), The Ute PAC hereby consents to toll the statute of limitations for any civil enforcement action the Commission might institute pursuant to 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(6) for an additional period of fifty-six (56) calendar days.


This agreement will extend the time to institute a civil law enforcement suit for a period of an additional fifty-six (56) calendar days from the expiration date of the five-year statute of limitations found at 28 U.S.C. § 2462 or any other statute of limitations or repose that may be applicable in this matter.

This additional fifty-six (56) days represents, and accounts for, the following two periods of time: (1) twenty-four (24) days extending from the date when the former treasurer informed the Commission that he was no longer associated with the Committee (March 2, 2020) to the date on which the Committee selected a new treasurer (March 26, 2020); and (2) thirty-two (32) days extending from the date when the most recent records request was due (April 30, 2020) to the extended due date to complete that request (June 1, 2020).

Previously, on October 28, 2019, the Ute PAC agreed to toll the statute of limitations for a total of seventeen (17) days. Thus, the total length of time that the Ute PAC has agreed to toll

the statute of limitations to date is seventeen (17) days plus fifty-six (56) days, or seventy-three (73) calendar days

There shall be no additional consent to extend the time to institute a civil law enforcement suit without the written consent of The Ute PAC.
