Dear Mr. Alexander:

On November 3, 2022, the Federal Election Commission notified you of a complaint alleging that The Center for Advancement of Integrity and Justice (“CAIJ”) may have violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the “Act”).

On February 27, 2024, the Commission considered the complaint, but there was an insufficient number of votes to find reason to believe CAIJ violated 52 U.S.C. § 30122 and 11 C.F.R. § 110.4(b) or to dismiss the complaint. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission decision will follow.
