COMPLAINT

This complaint is filed under 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(d) and 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1) against Kumar for Congress, and Surya Hotha, its Treasurer (collectively, "Respondents"), for violating the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act") and Federal Election Commission (the "FEC" or "Commission") regulations. There is compelling evidence that Respondents have violated FEC regulations by accepting campaign contributions in excess of the contributions limits and not properly refunding those contributions. Moreover, a review of the reports filed by Respondents demonstrate a host of other reporting violations, including inaccurate contributor titles and addresses, and incorrect disclosure of the election cycle to date contributions by certain contributors. Many of the same violations addressed in this complaint have also been identified by the Commission's Reports Analysis Division in various Requests for Additional Information sent to Respondents. We urge the Commission to immediately

investigate these violations and levy appropriate sanctions against Respondents for their failure to comply with crucial and basic requirements of the Act and Commission regulations.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

Rishi Kumar was a candidate for election to the U.S. House of Representatives from California's newly redrawn 16th Congressional District.¹

This complaint pertains to contributions received from twenty-three donors who contributed more than the federal contribution limit of \$2,900 for the primary election and \$2,900 for the general election. As of the date of this complaint, Respondents' latest filings do not disclose refunds to the donors in question. The specific contribution limit violations are addressed below for each donor.

I. Leasa Donovan

Over the course of the election cycle, Leasa Donovan contributed a total of \$17,200, all of which was designated for the primary election. Ms. Donovan's contributions exceeded the primary election limit of \$2,900 by \$14,300. Ms. Donovan's contributions were as follows:

II. Anjali Sridhar

Over the course of the election cycle, Anjali Sridhar contributed a total of \$14,100, \$11,200 of which was designated for the primary election. Ms. Sridhar's contributions exceeded the primary election limit of \$2,900 by \$8,300. Ms. Sridhar's contributions were as follows:

Ms. Somani contributed to the campaign on four different dates, but these contributions were disclosed using different addresses and slightly different job titles and employers. Ms. Somani's contributions were as follows¹¹:

Ms. Thirumale contributed to the campaign on December 30, 2021, but these contributions were disclosed using different addresses and slightly different job titles and employers. Ms. Thirumale's contributions were as follows¹²:

XX. Bill Gorman

Over the course of the election cycle, Bill Gorman contributed a total of \$7,100, all of which was designated for the general election. Mr. Gorman's contributions exceeded the general election limit of \$2,900 by \$4,200. Mr. Gorman's contributions were as follows:

XXIII. Narsimha Koppula

Over the course of the election cycle, Narsimha Koppula contributed a total of \$3,400, all of which was designated for the primary election. Ms. Koppula's contributions exceeded the primary election limit of \$2,900 by \$500. Ms. Koppula's contributions were as follows:

- 3/31/2022-Contribution of \$500. Designated for the primary election.
- 5/16/2022-Contribution of \$2900. Designated for the primary election. 60

LEGAL ANALYSIS

I. Applicable Law

The Act and Commission regulations prohibit federal candidates from soliciting, receiving, directing, transferring, or spending funds in connection with a federal campaign unless the funds are subject to the limitations, prohibitions, and reporting requirements under the Act. 61 In addition, the Act and Commission regulations require that contribution information be accurately reported to ensure appropriate disclosure of this important information to voters in advance of the election. 62

II. Respondents accepted contributions over the legal contribution limit from multiple individuals in violation of the Act and Commission Regulations.
When prompted by the Commission's Reports Analysis Division to address these excessive contributions, Respondents did not respond to the Commission's Requests for Additional Information.

As outlined in detail in the factual analysis portion of this complaint, Respondents accepted contributions in excess of the legal limit from over twenty donors over the course of a

two-year election cycle and blatantly violated the contribution limits imposed by the Act and Commission regulations.

Individuals or political committees other than authorized committee or qualified multicandidate committee are not permitted to make a contribution to a candidate for federal office in
excess of \$2,900 per election. ⁶³ Despite this limitation, in multiple instances Respondents
accepted contributions from individuals in excess of this limit. In addition, this violation was
pointed out to the committee in numerous Requests for Additional Information (RFAIs) sent to
the committee from the Reports Analysis Division, none of which prompted an explanatory
response from Respondents, or reports demonstrating redesignations or refunds of the excessive
contributions to cure this issue. ⁶⁴ Instead, Respondents kept the illegal contributions and used
those contributions in connection with the 2022 primary and general elections.

III. In some instances, Respondents did not accurately report information regarding contributions received and thereby misled the public regarding the permissibility of certain contributions.

Commission regulations require political committees to accurately report the total contributions received during the election cycle from each contributor on the committee's campaign reports. ⁶⁵ In addition, committees are required to accurately report the mailing address and occupation and employer for contributions received from individuals. ⁶⁶ As discussed in the factual analysis portion of this complaint, in some instances Respondents inaccurately disclosed the election-cycle-to-date total for certain contributors and reported misleading information

regarding the address and occupation of certain contributors in violation of Commission regulations.⁶⁷ These reporting violations misled the public by inaccurately creating the perception that some of the impermissible contributions were permissible.

REQUESTED ACTION

As shown, Respondents appear to have repeatedly violated the Act and Commission regulations by accepting funds from individuals in excessive of the legal contribution limit.

Accordingly, we respectfully request that the Commission immediately investigate these violations, fine Respondents the maximum amount permitted by law, and enjoin Respondents from further violations of the law.
