**Alleged Statutory and**

The Complaint alleges that Keith for Mayor (the “Mayoral Committee”), Keith Pekau’s state committee, made a prohibited and excessive in-kind contribution to his principal campaign committee, Pekau for Congress and Cynthia Katsenes in her official capacity as treasurer (the “Federal Committee”), in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the “Act”), by transferring a Facebook account and its almost 2,000 followers.<sup>1</sup> The Amended Complaint also alleges that Pekau and certain Trustees of the Village of Orland Park, Cynthia Nelson Katsenes, Michael Milani, Sean Kampas, and Joni Radazewski (the “Trustees”), solicited city contractors to participate in a golf outing fundraiser for the Federal Committee, resulting in

1 the impermissible solicitation and receipt of in-kind corporate contributions.<sup>2</sup> Finally, the  
2 Complaint alleges People Over Politics, a local political committee registered in the state of  
3 Illinois, should have registered and reported as a political committee with the Commission,  
4 because the Federal Committee used the phrase “People Over Politics” on its website and public  
5 communications, which the Complaint alleges resulted in an in-kind contribution from People  
6 Over Politics to the Federal Committee.<sup>3</sup>

7 The Response submitted on behalf of Pekau, the Federal Committee, and People Over  
8 Politics (the “Joint Response”) asserts that the Facebook account is owned not by the Mayoral  
9 Committee, but by the candidate, and therefore no transfer between the Mayoral and Federal  
10 Committees occurred, and denies that anyone acting on behalf of the Committee solicited  
11 corporate contributions asserting that the emails attached to the Complaint are inaccurate (the  
12 Joint Response provides copies of the original emails which include warnings among Pekau  
13 supporters to abide by federal campaign finance law).<sup>4</sup> Finally, the Joint Response argues that  
14 the phrase “People Over Politics” is a common slogan unrelated to the group People Over  
15 Politics.<sup>5</sup> The Trustees submitted a separate response (the “Trustees Response”) denying that  
16 they used Orland Park resources to send or receive communications regarding the golf  
17 fundraiser.<sup>6</sup>


Based on its experience and expertise, the Commission has established an Enforcement Priority System using formal, pre-determined scoring criteria to allocate agency resources and assess whether particular matters warrant further administrative enforcement proceedings. These criteria include (1) the gravity of the alleged violation, taking into account both the type of activity and the amount in violation; (2) the apparent impact the alleged violation may have had on the electoral process; (3) the complexity of the legal issues raised in the matter; and (4) recent trends in potential violations and other developments in the law. This matter is rated as low priority for Commission action after application of these pre-established criteria. Given that low rating, and apparent low dollar amount at issue, we recommend that the Commission dismiss the Complaint, consistent with the Commission's prosecutorial discretion to determine the proper ordering of its priorities and use of agency resources.<sup>7</sup> We also recommend that the Commission close the file effective 30 days after the date the certification of this vote is signed (or on the next business day after the 30th day, if the 30th day falls on a weekend or holiday) and send the appropriate letters.


