On April 27, 2023, your clients were notified that the Federal Election Commission received a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). At that time, your clients were given a copy of the complaint and informed that a response to the complaint should be submitted within 15 days of the receipt of the notification.

On May 25, 2023, the Commission received additional information from the complainant pertaining to the allegations in the complaint. Enclosed is a copy of this additional information.
