On April 9, 2024, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Yes on Prop 36 – Californians for Safer Communities, Sponsored by Golden State Communities f/k/a Californians to Reduce Homelessness, Drug Addiction, and Theft, sponsored by Golden State Communities (“CRHDAT”), of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. A copy of the complaint was forwarded to your client at that time.

Upon review of the allegations in the complaint and information provided by your client, on March 24, 2025, the Commission voted to dismiss this matter effective April 25, 2025.
