I, Vicktoria J. Allen, recording secretary of the Federal Election Commission executive session, do hereby certify that on May 14, 2024, the Commission took the following actions in the above-captioned matter:

1. Failed by a vote of 2-3 to:
  - a. Open a Matter Under Review.
  - b. Find reason to believe that Democratic Executive Committee of Florida and Fran Garcia in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b)(2), (4) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a), (b) by failing to timely and accurately disclose receipts and disbursements.
  - c. Find reason to believe that Democratic Executive Committee of Florida and Fran Garcia in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.9 by knowingly accepting excessive contributions.
  - d. Approve the Factual and Legal Analysis, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated April 17, 2024.
  - e. Authorize conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe.
  - f. Approve the Conciliation Agreement, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated April 17, 2024.
  - g. Approve the appropriate letter.

Commissioners Broussard and Weintraub voted affirmatively for the motion.

Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, and Trainor dissented. Commissioner Lindenbaum was recused and did not vote.

2. Decided by a vote of 5-0 to:

- a. Open a Matter Under Review. MUR 8261
- b. Find reason to believe that Democratic Executive Committee of Florida and Fran Garcia in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b)(2), (4) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a), (b) by failing to timely and accurately disclose receipts and disbursements.
- c. Find reason to believe that Democratic Executive Committee of Florida and Fran Garcia in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.9 by knowingly accepting excessive contributions.
- d. Approve the Factual and Legal Analysis, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated April 17, 2024.
- e. Authorize conciliation prior to a finding of probable cause to believe.
- f. Approve the Conciliation Agreement, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated April 17, 2024, [REDACTED]
- g. Approve the appropriate letter.

Commissioners Broussard, Cooksey, Dickerson, Trainor, and Weintraub voted affirmatively for the decision. Commissioner Lindenbaum was recused and did not vote.
