Dear Messrs. Wilson and Morrison, and Ms. Sharma:

On August 20, 2024, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Friends of Sherrod Brown and Judith Zamore in her official capacity as treasurer, of information obtained in the normal course of carrying out the Commission's supervisory responsibilities indicating that your client may have violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). On August 22, 2024, the Commission also notified your client of a Complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Act. On February 25, 2025, based on the information provided in the Commission determined to exercise its prosecutorial discretion to

dismiss the allegations contained in the Complaint in MUR 8303. Accordingly, the Commission closed its files in these matters. Enclosed for your information is a copy of the General Counsel's Report, which more fully explains the Commission's decision.

The Commission will place documents related to MUR 8303 on the public record today. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). 

Based on its experience and expertise, the Commission has established an Enforcement
Priority System using formal, pre-determined scoring criteria to allocate agency resources and assess
whether matters warrant further administrative enforcement proceedings. These criteria include
(1) the gravity of the alleged violation, taking into account both the type of activity and the amount
in violation; (2) the apparent impact the alleged violation may have had on the electoral process;
(3) the complexity of the legal issues raised in the matter; and (4) recent trends in potential violations
and other developments in the law. This matter is rated as low priority for Commission action after
application of these pre-established criteria. Given that low rating, the apparent low dollar amount
involved, and the Committee's amendment of its 2024 July Quarterly Report, we recommend that
the Commission

dismiss the Complaint in MUR 8303
consistent with the Commission's prosecutorial discretion to determine the proper ordering of its
priorities and use of agency resources. We also recommend that the Commission close the file
effective 30 days from the date the certification of this vote is signed (or on the next business day
