On November 1, 2024, the Federal Election Commission notified you of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). A copy of the complaint was forwarded to you at that time.

Upon further review of the allegations contained in the complaint, and information supplied in response, the Commission, on February 12, 2025, voted to dismiss this matter and close the file effective March 17, 2025. The General Counsel's Report, which more fully explains the Commission's decision, is enclosed for your information.

19	The Complaint alleges that Dave Giles for Congress and Douglas Wolfe in his official				
20	capacity as treasurer (the "Committee"), the principal campaign committee of David V. Giles, 1 a				
21	2024 candidate in Arizona's 4th Congressional District, ² did not disclose complete identifying				
22	information for several contributors and did not make best efforts to obtain, maintain, and submit				
23	the same, totaling \$8,469, in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended				
24	(the "Act"). ³ The Complaint characterizes 134 contributions from contributors with the same first				
25	and last name and an address outside of Arizona as "suspiciously irregular" and "illegitimate,"				
26	alleging that the Committee's disclosures "appear to be incomplete" and the contributors' names				
27	appear to be "inconsistently spelled." ⁴

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In Response, Giles and the Committee both state that the Committee's disclosure reports contain contributor information "extracted from credit card processing agents" and state that the Committee "reported the contributions as provided by the processing agents." The Committee filed a Termination Report which was accepted as a termination prior to the submission of the Complaint.⁶ Based on its experience and expertise, the Commission has established an Enforcement Priority System using formal, pre-determined scoring criteria to allocate agency resources and assess whether particular matters warrant further administrative enforcement proceedings. These criteria include (1) the gravity of the alleged violation, taking into account both the type of activity and the amount in violation; (2) the apparent impact the alleged violation may have had on the electoral process; (3) the complexity of the legal issues raised in the matter; and (4) recent trends in potential violations and other developments in the law. This matter is rated as low priority for Commission action after application of these pre-established criteria. Given that low rating, and apparent low dollar amount at issue, we recommend that the Commission dismiss the Complaint, consistent with the Commission's prosecutorial discretion to determine the proper ordering of its priorities and use of agency resources.⁷ We also recommend that the Commission close the file
