This is in reference to the complaint filed with the Federal Election Commission on November 6, 2024, concerning Elder for America. Based on that complaint, and after considering the circumstances of this matter and information provided in response to the complaint, the Commission determined to dismiss this matter and close the file effective April 18, 2025.

The General Counsel's Report, which more fully explains the basis for the Commission's decision, is enclosed. Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record today. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action within 60 days of the dismissal, which became effective today. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).



1 electoral process; (3) the complexity of the legal issues raised in the matter; and (4) recent trends in  
 2 potential violations and other developments in the law. This matter is rated as low priority for  
 3 Commission action after application of these pre-established criteria. Given that low rating and low  
 4 apparent dollar amount at issue we recommend that the Commission dismiss the Complaint,  
 5 consistent with the Commission's prosecutorial discretion to determine the proper ordering of its  
 6 priorities and use of agency resources.<sup>4</sup> We also recommend that the Commission close the file  
 7 effective 30 days from the date the certification of this vote is signed (or on the next business day  
 8 after the 30th day, if the 30th day falls on a weekend or holiday) and send the appropriate letters.
