Buy American Act Report for Fiscal Year 2012
[*Buy American Act*, 41 U.S.C. 10a-10c.]

Data from the Federal Procurement Data System Next Generation (FPDS-ng) indicates that the Federal Election Commission has purchased one product manufactured outside of the United States. FPDS-ng is the automated online data system established by the Federal Procurement Data Center (FPDC) that collects historical and statistical information about the government's procurement contracts. This is done primarily to meet the information needs of the Congress, federal agencies and the public. The web site for reporting and obtaining data is <https://www.fpds.gov/>.

No waivers have been granted with respect to such articles, materials or supplies under the Buy America Act (41 USC 10(a) et seq.).

For the FY 2012 reporting period, there were a total of 68 requirements reported to the FPDS-ng system. Of the 68 actions, one was procured from an outside US source. The total funding spent on manufactured products within the US is \$1,247,096.99. The total funding spent on manufactured products outside of the US is \$14,927.57. Most of the supply and equipment purchases made were procured using GSA Federal Supply Schedule (FSS) vendors.

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
