*These totals were calculated based on campaign finance reports filed with the Commission between January 1, 2019 and March 31, 2020 by authorized committees of current and former 2019 and 2020 congressional candidates.

**The data presented in these statistical summaries do not include some reports filed on paper. To minimize COVID-19 exposure, the Commission closed its office headquarters in mid-March 2020 and suspended processing of reports submitted on paper until the agency resumes normal operations. Financial activity of paper filers will be accounted for in the first statistical release after the reopening of the agency's office. (Approximately 94 percent of reports submitted to the Commission are filed electronically. Electronic filing is mandatory for all filers who receive contributions or make expenditures that exceed \$50,000 in a calendar year, or have reason to expect to do so.)
