PAC CONTRIBUTIONS EXCEED \$22 MILLION

WASHINGTON -- PAC contributions to federal candidates totalled \$22.8 million for the first fifteen months of the 1982 election cycle. More than half of that amount, \$16.3 million, was contributed during the non-election year.

Information on PAC activity during 1981 and the first three months of 1982 was released today by the Federal Election Commission.

The information shows that PAC's raised \$109.1 million and spent \$75.8 million, giving \$22.8 million of that amount in contributions to federal candidates.

During the first fifteen months of the 1979-80 election cycle, PAC's raised approximately \$71.6 million, spent \$48.7 million and contributed \$14.3 million to federal candidates, (\$9.2 million of that amount had been given in the non-election year.)

Total PAC contributions to 1980 Congressional races were \$55.2 million. In 1978, Congressional campaigns received \$34.1 million. Figures are not available for 1976.

To date, incumbents have received more PAC money than challengers. PAC contributions to Democrats exceed the amount given to Republicans. Contribution figures for various categories of candidates are included on the attached chart.

Also included is a list of the top 10 PAC's, including the top money raisers, those which have spent the most money and those which have contributed the most to candidates through the Spring of 1982.
