1981-82 PAC GIVING UP 51%

WASHINGTON -- Political action committee contributions to 1981-82 Congressional campaigns increased 51% over 1979-80 PAC activity. Total spending by these committees rose 47%.

Federal Election Commission figures released today reveal that PAC's contributed \$83.1 million to the 1982 Congressional races, compared with \$55.2 million given just two years ago.

An additional \$4 - \$5 million in contributions was given by PAC's in 1981-82 either to retire debts from previous campaigns or for future races. That brings total PAC contributions for the two-year election cycle to \$87.3 million; in 1979-80, the final figure was \$60.2 million.

In addition to contributions, PAC's spent \$5.3 million on independent expenditures -- monies spent to advocate the election or defeat of candidates, which are made without the cooperation of or consultation with any candidate's campaign.

PAC's also contributed \$6 million to political party committees.

During 1981-82, PAC's raised \$199.3 million and spent \$190.4 million. They began the cycle with \$22.5 million cash-on-hand and ended with \$31.4 million, owing just over \$5 million as of December 31, 1982.

Although the FEC study looked at the activity of some 3,727 PAC's, by the end of 1982, there were 3,371 in existence.

Incumbents received 3½ times as much PAC money as did challengers, receiving 66% of all PAC contributions to challengers 19%.

The gap between contributions given to Democrats versus Republicans widened -Democrats received 54%; Republicans, 46%. In 1980, the split was 52% to 47%.


