## FEC PUBLISHES FINAL 1981-82 PAC STUDY

WASHINGTON -- The Federal Election Commission has released its final study on PAC activity for the 1981-82 election cycle. The Report confirms an earlier study which showed that PAC contributions to 1981-82 Congressional campaigns were 51.4% higher than PAC contributions to 1979-80 Congressional races, and that total spending by PAC's increased 45% from the 1980 to the 1982 election cycles.

Available as a four-volume set, FEC Reports on Financial Activity, 1981-82, Final Report: Party and Non-Party Political Committees, the study sells for \$5 per volume and may be purchased through the Commission's Office of Public Records, 1325 K Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20463. Payment in advance is required.

Highlights from the Report show that:

Incumbents received almost 3½ times as much PAC money as did challengers, receiving 66% of all PAC contributions to 19% for challengers;

The gap between contributions given to Democrats versus Republicans widened - Democrats received 54.3%; Republicans, 46%. In 1979-80, the split was 52% to 47%.

During 1981-82, PAC's raised \$199.5 million and spent \$190.2 million. They began the cycle with \$22.2 million cash-on-hand and ended with \$31.5 million, owing just over \$5.2 million on December 31, 1982. Their contributions to 1981-82 Congressional campaigns totalled \$83.6 million. They gave an additional \$4 million to federal candidates to retire debts from previous campaigns or for future races, bringing total PAC contributions to \$87.6 million. PAC's also gave \$6 million to political parties.

The FEC study looked at the activity of 3,722 PAC's. However, by the end of 1982, there were only 3,371 PAC's in existence.
