FEC RELEASES FINAL REPORT ON 1981-82 CONGRESSIONAL ELECTIONS

WASHINGTON -- The cost of waging successful Senate campaigns rose 70.5% from 1980 to 1982. Winning House campaign costs increased by 47% in the same two-year period. These figures come from a final Report just released by the Federal Election Commission on the campaign finance activity of U.S. Senate and House campaigns for the 1981-82 election cycle.

According to FEC data, the 33 successful Senate campaigns raised \$70.7 million and spent \$68.2 million. Their 439 counterparts in the House raised \$123.1 million and spent \$114.7 million.

Successful campaigns also received the majority of PAC contributions - 70%, or \$58.4 million of the \$83.7 million contributed to 1981-82 Congressional candidates. Senate winners received \$15.6 million, which was 19% of all PAC contributions and 69% of the PAC money given to all Senate campaigns. House winners took in \$42.7 million in PAC dollars, which accounted for 51% of all of the \$83.7 million total and 70% of the total given to House races.

Figures are in millions of dollars. 1975-76 figures were compiled in a different manner than those from subsequent years. They do, however, provide a base for comparison.

Total spending for Senate and House campaigns amounted to \$342.4 million - an increase of 43.3% over the \$239 million spent in 1979-80. Fundraising increased 42.6% - from \$248.8 million in 1979-80, to \$354.7 million in 1981-82. Spending for House races increased by 50% (from \$136 to \$204 million); Senate races increased 34.5% (from \$102.9 to \$138.4 million). Fundraising for House candidates increased 48% (from \$144.0 to \$213.2 million); Senate candidates raised 35.1% more (\$104.8 to \$141.5 million.)

The pages which follow detail the financial activity of Senate and House candidates according to party affiliation and candidate status (incumbent/challenger/open seat). Also listed are the campaigns which raised and spent the most money and those which received the most PAC money.
