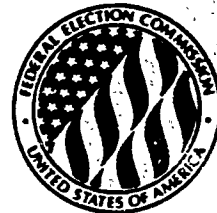

FEC ISSUES FOURTH DETAILED 1984 PRESIDENTIAL REPORT

WASHINGTON -- Figures released today by the Federal Election Commission indicate that by the end of March 1984, 13 Presidential campaigns had raised \$70.2 million and spent \$60.2 million. These statistics are contained in a FEC Report on Financial Activity, 1983-1984, Interim Report No. 4, Presidential Pre-Nomination Campaigns.

This Report is the fourth of a series presenting, in detail, the financial activity of all Presidential campaigns which have exceeded \$100,000. Subsequent statistical information will be issued regularly as the campaign cycle proceeds. The final report will be issued in early 1985, including activity from the start of each campaign through December 31, 1984.

A summary of figures in the FEC study show that:

- * 13 candidates raised \$70.2 million;
- * Of the total raised, approximately \$44.2 million, or 63% came from contributions from individuals;
- * The amount of Federal matching funds received by the candidates through March totalled \$17.8 million or 25.4% of the total reported receipts;
- * Loans received by the candidates which were still unpaid as of the end of March, totalled \$6.9 million, or 9.8% of the total raised;
- * Contributions from PACs and other committees comprised approximately 1.4% of the total funds raised, or \$1.0 million;
- * While the 13 campaigns in the study spent \$60.2 million, 10 committees receiving public funds spent a total of \$56.2 million subject to overall limits, including fundraising exemptions.

[Certain information in the Report for Cranston for President Committee is incomplete for the first three months of 1984. Total receipts and Federal matching funds for the committee are complete through March, while other receipt information is complete through December 31, 1983. In addition, debts owed by the Cranston campaign reflect only outstanding loans and do not include debts owed to vendors.]

The FEC Presidential Interim Reports include financial tables and graphs describing the various sources of monies raised by the campaigns. The study delineates the distribution of individual contributions - large or small - and distinguishes between the types of PAC money given to each candidate, along with the time periods when the monies were contributed. Additional tables provide information on the spending allocated to individual states by each candidate, and the amount of large individual contributions flowing to the campaigns from each state.

Another table details independent expenditures and communications costs by individuals, PACs, corporations, unions, and delegate committees on behalf of candidates. A final series of charts show the net financial picture of individual campaigns for each reporting period throughout the campaign.
