FEC RELEASES REPORT ON 1984 CONGRESSIONAL RACES

WASHINGTON -- The Federal Election Commission has released its Interim Report covering the full 24 months of the 1984 Congressional elections. Among other things, it shows:

***Total spending in Congressional races rose only 9.3% over 1982 levels.** This increase in spending is considerably less than increases occurring between previous election cycles. From 1980 to 1982, spending increased by approximately 43%, and from 1978 to 1980, spending increased by 23%. Below are figures for activity by all candidates for House and Senate races in the four election cycles:

***Spending in Senate races increased 23.1% over spending in 1982.** Although this is less than the increases which occurred between the 1978-1980 and 1980-1982 elections, it still represents a substantial increase.

***By contrast, spending for House races decreased by .2%.** This is a marked difference from the increases seen between 1978 and 1982 in House contests.

A major reason for the difference lies in the nature of the election cycles themselves. Spending is often affected by the status of the candidates and the margin of victory in the general election.

In 1983-84, there were more incumbent candidates involved in "safe" seats, (where the margin of victory was 60% or more,) than in previous election cycles. In addition, there was an unusually small number of House seats in which the incumbent did not run for re-election. These Open Seat races are usually the most expensive races.

In Appendix IV, a table lists the average spent by candidates who won or lost by various margins. It will show that, in each category, the average spent in 1984 increased over previous years. However, since the predominate number of candidates for 1984 House seats were incumbents who won with 60% or more of the vote, and since they tended to, on average, spend less money than their fellow 1984 candidates, overall spending for 1984 House races appears to have declined.

***PAC money represented 26% of all moneys raised in Congressional races.** The amount of PAC money contributed to Congressional campaigns increased in 1984 to \$104.9 million. Once again, this was a smaller increase in total contributions than in past Congressional elections. Total PAC contributions for each of four past election cycles appear below, in dollar amount and as a percentage of total funds raised:

PAC money continued to represent less than 20% of funds raised in Senate races while playing an increasing role in House campaigns.

*The cost of winning a seat in Congress continued to increase in 1984. Similar to overall spending, increases were found more in Senate races than in House contests. Figures below detail amounts spent for winning races in 4 election cycles.

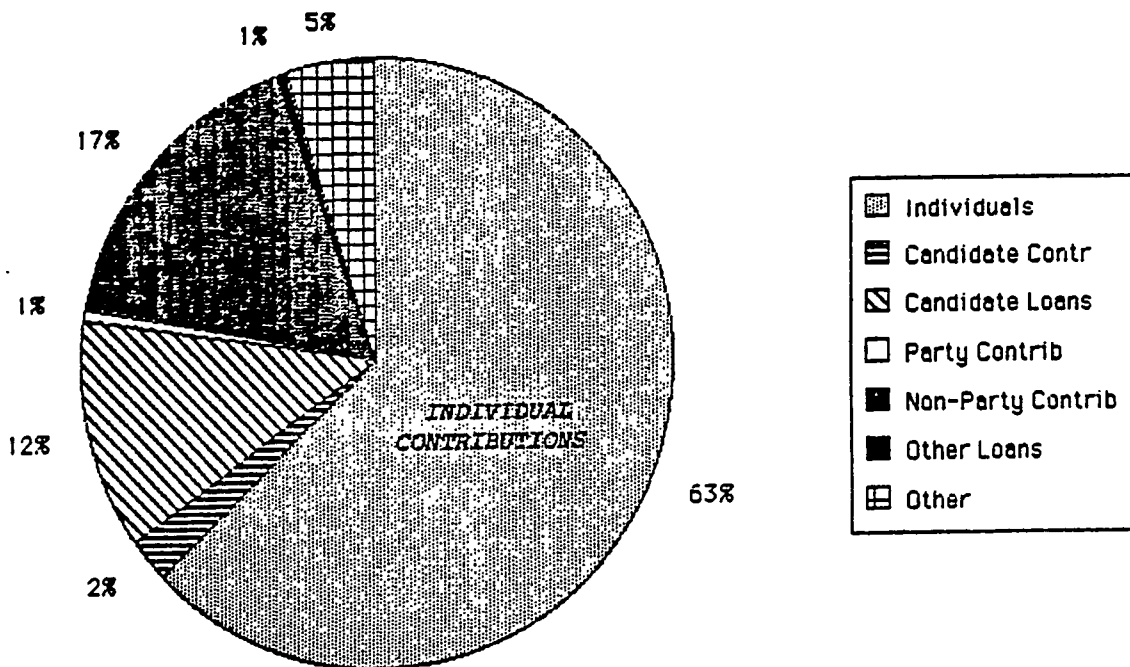

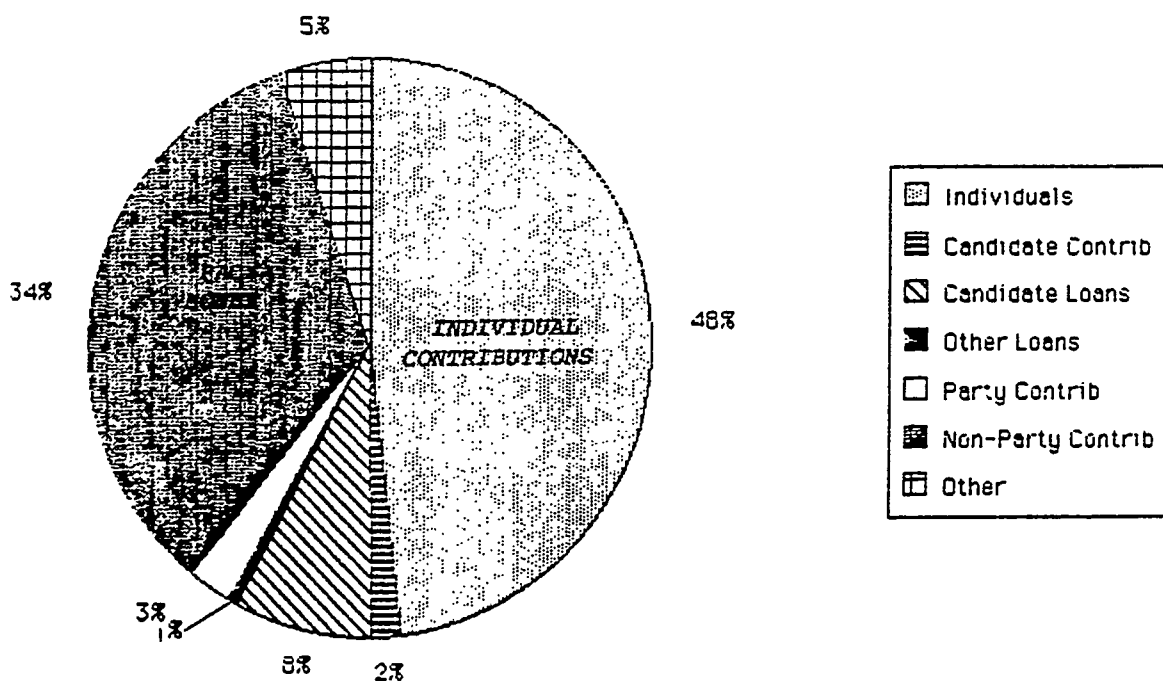
