FEC FINAL 1984 REPORT SHOWS REPUBLICANS STILL HOLD FINANCIAL LEAD

WASHINGTON -- Final Federal Election Commission figures for the 1983-84 election cycle show that while the Republican Party maintained a three-to-one lead over the Democratic Party in overall financial activity, the Democrats increased their activity by a substantial margin over 1981-82 and 1979-80, when they trailed the Republicans by more than five-to-one.

From January 1, 1983, through December 31, 1984, the Republican Party raised \$297.9 million and spent \$300.8 million, an increase of approximately 40% over 1982 levels. The Party began the cycle with \$7.5 million cash-on-hand.

The Democrats, beginning with only \$1.4 million cash-on-hand, raised \$98.5 million and spent \$97.4 million. This was an increase of 151% in receipts over 1982, and an increase of 143% in spending for the same period.

In direct support of federal candidates for the '84 elections, the Republican Party spent only twice as much as the Democrats. Contributions to Presidential, Senate and House campaigns, as well as general election expenditures on their behalf totalled \$25 million for the Republicans and \$11.6 million for the Democrats. In the 1982 elections, Republican direct support totalled \$20 million, compared to Democratic support of \$5 million - a four-to-one difference.

Contributions made directly to Senate and House campaigns by the Democratic Party increased only slightly in 1984 over 1982 (\$1.8 million compared to \$1.7 million.) However, general election expenditures made by the Party on behalf of its candidates continued the dramatic rise begun in the '82 elections. The Democrats spent \$4.4 million on behalf of Senate campaigns in the fall of 1984, an increase of 83% over 1982 levels. The \$1.8 million spent for House candidates in 1984 was a 129% increase over 1982.

GOP contributions to federal candidates in the 1984 elections dropped by 15%, totalling \$4.9 million compared to \$5.6 million contributed in 1982. While spending twice as much as the Democrats on its general election candidates, the Republican Party actually spent 29% less on Senate campaigns in 1984 than in 1982 (\$6.8 million compared to \$8.7 million), and only increased by 14% its spending on House races (\$6.3 million compared to \$5.5 million.)

FEC data shows that both parties managed to end the cycle with fewer debts than in the 1982 elections: as of December 31, 1984, Republicans had debts of \$2 million, with cash-on-hand of \$4.9 million; Democrats had debts totalling \$3 million, with \$2.4 million cash-on-hand. In late December 1982, those figures were: Republicans - \$5.3 million debt, \$7.5 million cash-on-hand; Democrats - \$4.1 million debt, \$1.4 million cash-on-hand.

The national committees of the Democratic Party reported receiving \$12 million in loans during the '84 election cycle and made loan repayments totalling \$13 million during the same two-year period, which accounted for approximately 17-18% of their total financial activity. The Republican national committees reported no loan activity.

The Republican Party received a greater percentage of money from individuals, 88%, than the Democratic Party, which received 59% of its funds from individuals. PAC money accounted for 7% of the Democratic Party's receipts and one-half of one percent of Republican Party revenues.


