SECOND MONTHLY PRESIDENTIAL REPORTS SHOW SPENDING OVER \$146 MILLION

WASHINGTON -- Presidential candidates raised over \$166 million and spent more than \$146 million by the end of February. The Federal Election Commission's continuing series of summary reports on 1988 Presidential campaign finance activity was updated today with the addition of figures through February 1988.

The FEC summary figures are based on monthly reports, which are filed during the election year by all presidential campaigns exceeding \$100,000 in activity. The reports were due to be filed March 20, and included receipts and disbursements for the month of February, as well as for the campaign to date. All campaigns which have been declared eligible to receive federal matching funds, as well as three additional campaigns which had significant financial activity in 1987, are listed in the FEC report - eighteen candidates in all.

Comparable figures are provided for 1984 campaigns.

FEC figures on the following pages have been adjusted for contribution refunds, loan repayments and offsets to operating expenditures, affording the reader a more realistic look at monies raised and spent.

State spending by each campaign is provided, along with maps to graphically depict the variations and/or spending patterns.

A set of graphs has been included to show the receipts of each campaign, by source, for each reporting period in 1987 and for two months of 1988.

FOOTNOTES FOR TABLES
AND MAPS

Figures listed in the preceding tables are net calculations; that is, amounts have been subtracted for contribution refunds, loan repayments, and refunds or rebates received (offsets).

Receipt categories will add up to campaign totals except for the following:

- 1/ Dole ----- Total includes \$250,000 from Dole for Senate Committee.
- 2/ Kemp ----- Total includes \$440,000 from Victory '88 (formerly Kemp Superbowl Brunch).
- 3/ Dukakis -- Total includes \$394,300 from Dukakis Gubernatorial Committee.
- 4/ Gephardt - Total includes \$90,000 from Gephardt in Congress Committee.

The tables and maps on pages 5 - 11 represent state-by-state expenditures as reported by the 1988 Presidential campaigns. Before attempting to draw any conclusions about state-by-state spending, it is important to consider the following:

—The figures presented are preliminary, since reports are often amended due to omissions, errors, and/or changes in the data over time.

—Data for different campaigns may not be comparable. Although FEC regulations require state-by-state allocation of money spent for media, staff, equipment, etc., each campaign employs its own method for determining the distribution of those expenses. Certain expenditures may not be allocated to any state, since they more closely relate to the campaign's "national" effort.

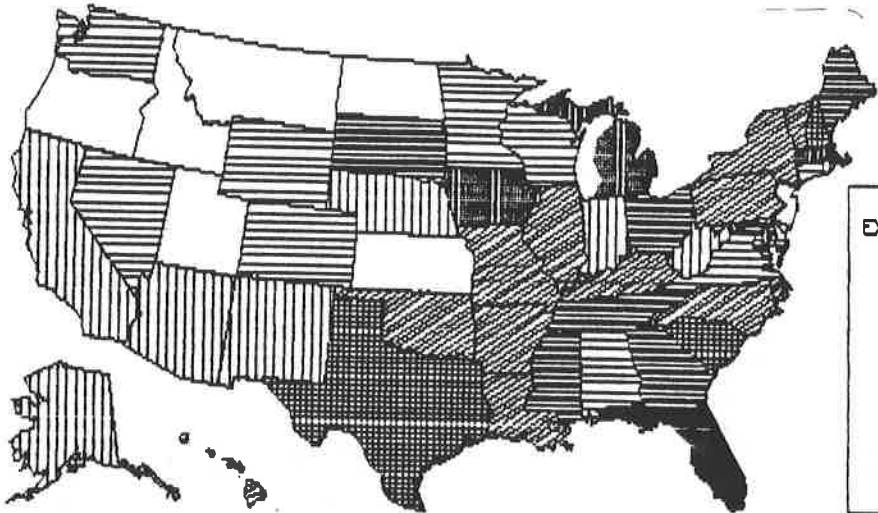

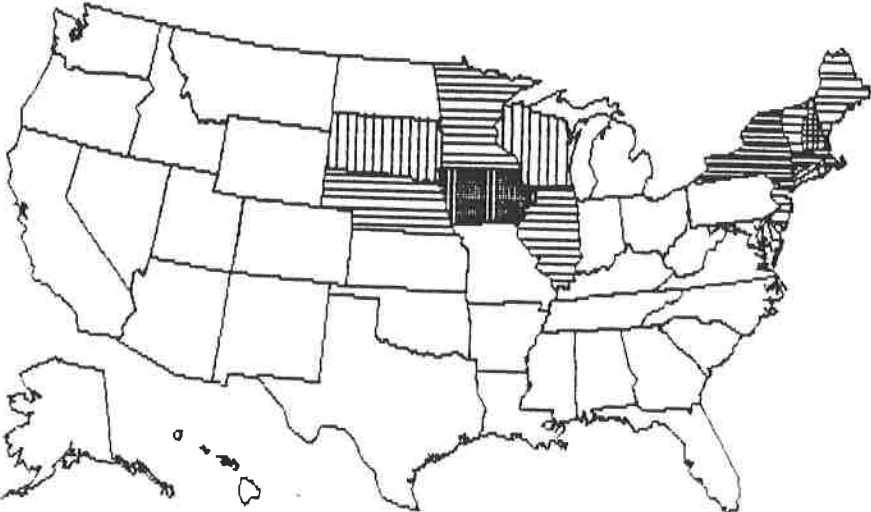

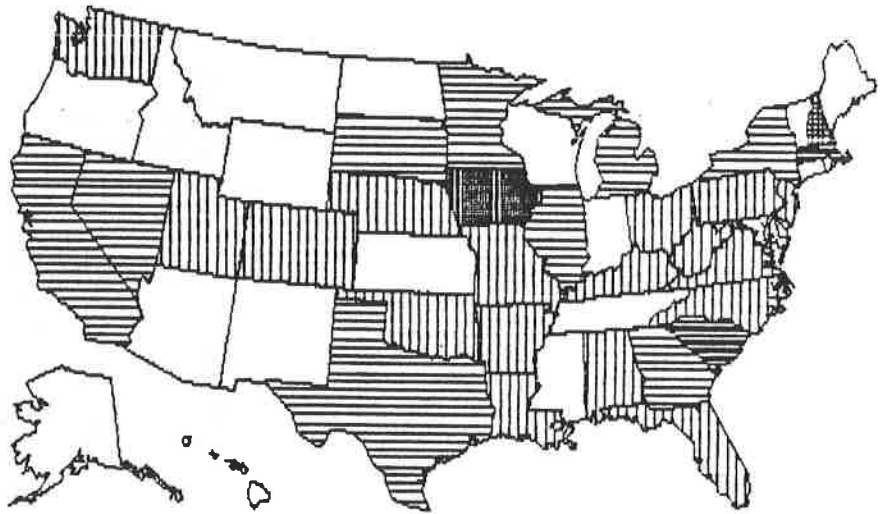
STATE BY STATE SPENDING

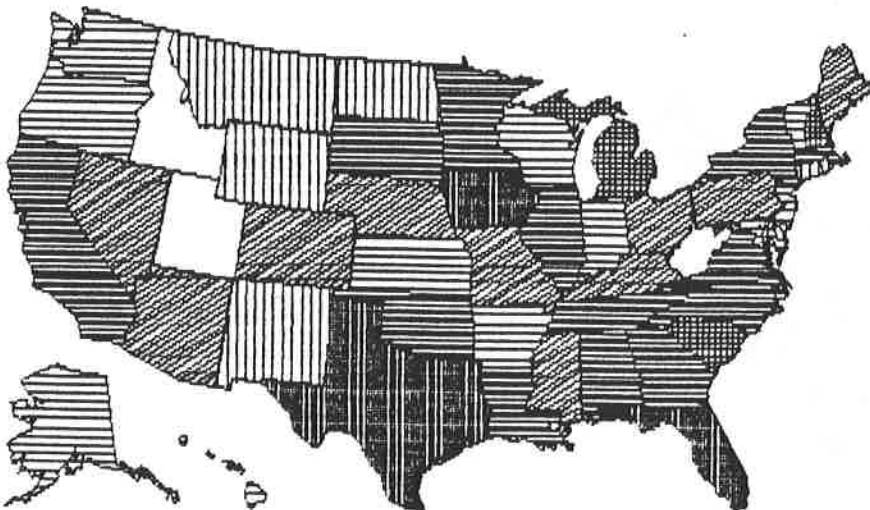

FEC RELEASES THIRD MONTHLY SUMMARY REPORT ON 1988 PRESIDENTIAL SPENDING

WASHINGTON -- By the end of March, Presidential campaigns had spent over \$169 million, according to a report released today by the Federal Election Commission. Candidates reported raising \$175.7 million, \$45.5 million from federal matching funds.

The FEC summary figures for the 1988 presidential campaigns are based on monthly reports filed April 20, by all presidential campaigns exceeding \$100,000 in activity. The reports disclosed receipts and disbursements for the month of March, and summary figures for the entire campaign to date. All campaigns which have been declared eligible to receive federal matching funds, as well as three additional campaigns which had significant financial activity in 1987, are included in the FEC report - eighteen candidates in all.

Comparable figures are provided for 1984 campaigns.

FEC figures on the following pages have been adjusted for contribution refunds, loan repayments and offsets to operating expenditures, affording the reader a more realistic look at monies raised and spent.

State spending by each campaign is provided, along with maps to graphically depict the variations and/or spending patterns.

A set of graphs has been included to show the receipts of each campaign, by source, for each reporting period in 1987 and 1988.

Figures listed in the preceding tables are net calculations; that is, amounts have been subtracted for contribution refunds, loan repayments, and refunds or rebates received (offsets).

Receipt categories will add up to campaign totals except for the following:

- 1/ Dole ----- Total includes \$1.15 million transferred from the Dole for Senate Committee.
- 2/ Kemp ----- Total includes \$440,000 from Victory '88 (formerly Kemp Superbowl Brunch).
- 3/ Dukakis -- Total includes \$394,300 from Dukakis Gubernatorial Committee.
- 4/ Gephardt - Total includes \$90,000 transferred from Gephardt in Congress Committee.

The tables and maps on pages 6 - 12 represent state-by-state expenditures as reported by the 1988 Presidential campaigns. Before attempting to draw any conclusions about state-by-state spending, it is important to consider the following:

-- The figures presented are preliminary, since reports are often amended due to omissions, errors, and/or changes in the data over time.

-- Data for different campaigns may not be comparable. Although FEC regulations require state-by-state allocation of money spent for media, staff, equipment, etc., each campaign employs its own method for determining the distribution of those expenses. Certain expenditures may not be allocated to any state, since they more closely relate to the campaign's "national" effort.
